2 mos. ago. D.V.

P.I. Comes in for gen. exam. Has "rheumatic" pain
along sciatic nerve - 2 mos. duration. Relieved
by crossing legs. No dyspnoea, nocturia,
headaches, or digestive troubles. Appetite
good. Sleeps well. Sore throat about two
mos. ago.

Habits. Bowels - reg. Tea - occas. Coffee - 1.
Tob. - 2 pipes. Alc. - rarely.

Diet. BREAKFAST - cereal with sug. & cr., toast,
1 coffee with sug. & cr. LUNCH - soup, fish,
or meat, potato, bread & butter, pie or
pudding, 1 gl. milk. DINNER - meat, potato,
veg., bread & butter, pie or cake, 1 gl. milk.
WATER - 4 or 5 glasses. Candy - rarely.

P.E. Pulse 70. Temp. 98. Blood pressure, 122-100.
Tonsil large. Heart - slightly broad (1 c.m.)
mitral sys. P2 greater than A2. Compensation
perfect.

Urine. Pale. Sl. Ac. 1006. Alb. - 0. Sug. - 0.
Sed. - rare sq. cell and amorphous crystal.
No blood, pus, or casts.

Treatment. Reduction of 5 pounds weight. Tab. Sod. Salic.
5 grains each, 2 after meals.
