June 29, 1918 -

Sweet wife of mine,

Do you know I ran in
so full of your letters that
they keep popping up at the
most unexpected times and
places. A big bunch will
come through after being
dammed up some place, and
then for several days strag-
glers will find their way
to me. Isn't that a happy
state of affairs? Sure I like
it - so well in fact that
tho' right now its 10.30
and I've had a full day
that finished just a half
hour ago - I'm going to
answer it now - and answer
it in particular for yours

forgotten what it said -
but just talk to you.

I've a line sized job now -
making a map of all the
telephone lines in the sec-
tor and I'm allowed to tell
you that there are a lot
of them, but I'll know every
foot of ground we're protecting
we can't talk about
aerial activity, so you just
keep in mind that some
day you are going to hear
the most thrilling account
of an air battle that was
ever put out. Saw it last
night at real close range
and I'll never forget the
thrill of it - no I wasn't
in the air but I saw -
and it was beautiful. "Oh
