Sammys are here.

Fritz had settled  
down here to stay, and  
I don't blame him  
because it is really  
a beautiful country, of  
green fields - thick woods  
and magnificent hills.  
Every thing is fixed up  
for comfort and rest  
for tired troops, and  
the Germans are good

walkers in all our  
activities.

But at times they  
are liars. You'll notice  
to have ~~many~~ <sup>many</sup>  
been to the ~~good~~  
people's homes (which  
had ~~been~~ <sup>been</sup> completely destroyed  
and for no reason  
but vandalism. It's  
brutal crime.

Got a letter each  
from Mother and Sis  
and am happy as can
