Now all these numbers in paragraph

1. represent pictures of the 1st Div. that we want to keep see! Those

in par. 2 are pictures of the 2nd 3rd 4th Sig Bn and are included in the list of par. 1. so you won't need to get 'em. Those in ink

are also pictures of the battalion which are not included above and which we want. Altogether

there are 286 pictures - 255 in par 1 and 31 in ink, and they cost 10¢ each.

now we want three copies
of each - one for Capt. Frank W.
Brown - one for Capt. Geo. C. Cox and
one for you in time all of the 2nd S.B.
and the money for all is enclosed
in a money order. There are also
enclosed the addresses of two
people who are to receive the
pictures of Capts. Brown + Cox.
Send them by registered mail please.
You keep ours.

This list is a week ahead of
any in the Division for I saw
the pictures before they were pub-
lished, therefore you should not
have a great deal of difficulty in
getting them. Try and get all 6"X8"
is possible. I'm sending this to
you because I think you can get
more prompt action - and I know
you'll be interested in getting them?
