



### TO SEND A MESSAGE

To call a station make its call letter until acknowledged, at intervals giving the call or signal of the calling station. If the call letter of a station is unknown, signal - at intervals followed by the call or signal of the calling station until acknowledged.

Make a slight pause after each letter and also after "front." If the sender discovers that he has made an error, he should make "A A front," after which he begins the word in which the error occurred.

Acknowledgment (or) I under-stand.....MM front	Move a little up hill.....UU front
Cease signaling.....MMM front	Move a little down hill...DD front
Repeat after (word).....CC front	Signal faster.....FF front
A front (word)	Wait a moment.....= front
